Private Pilot Certificate

The Private Pilot Certificate is the initial window to being a pilot. It allows you to fly for business or pleasure on days with favorable weather. The training consists of a minimum of 40 hours of flight training as well as one-on-one ground school with your instructor.

Instrument Pilot Rating

The Instrument Rating is the next step. You will learn how to fly with only reference to the instrument panel in the airplane. Much emphasis is placed on situational awareness. The instrument rating sharpens your skills as a pilot in general and is required to fly in poor weather conditions. There is a pre-requisite of 30 hours of cross country time for this course.
